AGAP Theatre presents **The Turnaround** in Church Hall on Thu 14th April at 7.30pm. *No job, no prospects, and a pregnant girlfriend – life had lost its appeal for 19 year-old Adam McClay when he decided to get drunk and throw himself in the River Clyde. Then something happened that turned his world around. Waking up in a police station, he finds out that a volunteer from the local soup kitchen, called Joshua Davidson, died to rescue him. Faced with the guilt of Joshua's death, Adam is sentenced to community service at the soup kitchen among those Joshua knew and, through a series of encounters, he comes to realise that even the most broken lives are worth saving. Written and directed by Stephen Callaghan and performed by AGAP community theatre, The Turnaround is a modern story of hope and the triumph of God's redemptive grace in the lives of human beings, inspired by the words of Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman in the famous hymn, "Praise to the Holiest in the Height". Infused with Glasgow humour whilst also tackling some serious issues, the play is a fast-paced parable for Lent 2011 and carries the deeper meaning of Humanity's redemption through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.
