#### Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady

In England and Wales to ensure that the faithful will honour Our Lady on this Feast, their Bishops have chosen to celebrate the Solemnity on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup>

#### The New Translation – 'The Word of the Lord'

At the end of the readings and the Gospel at Mass, we are used to hearing 'This is the Word of the Lord'; 'This is the Gospel of the

Lord'. In the new translation, the words 'This is' are now left out and we will hear 'The Word of the Lord' and 'The Gospel of the Lord'. One of the reasons is that the Latin does not include 'This is'. But there is more to it than that. If the priest or deacon lifts the book and says 'This is', it can suggest that he is talking about the book itself. **The book is not the Word of God.** In fact, he is referring to the Word which has been proclaimed - which is alive and active. The words at the end of the readings are announcing a great event. They are telling us that God has spoken; that Christ is really and truly present. We respond 'Thanks be to God', or 'Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ' which is our acknowledgement that what we have heard is, indeed, the Word of God
