European Court of Human Rights made  
the statement on 23<sup>rd</sup> Dec. 2010 in its  
conclusion of "A, B, and C v. Ireland."

## Abuse of the Eucharist and Procedure for receiving Holy Communion

At Mass last Sunday  
night a young lady was observed  
to receive Holy Communion but,  
as she returned to her seat, she  
removed the host from her mouth  
with a disparaging remark about  
the taste and put it in her pocket.  
Sadly such incidents are not  
uncommon in the Church today  
with the loss of the sense of sin  
and of respect for anything, not  
least human life. Whilst we cannot  
do anything that will absolutely  
stop such abuse, I believe that if  
we follow the instructions of the  
Church about the correct manner  
for receiving the Eucharist then it  
will go some way to help. From  
now onwards I would ask you to  
please communicate in the manner  
laid down by the Church, which is  
as follows:

- **Before receiving the  
host.** Everyone should make a  
sign of reverence either by a  
single genuflection of the right  
knee, by a profound bow, or by  
the sign of the cross. If a person  
chooses to receive kneeling, then  
no other sign of reverence is  
required

- **On The tongue.**

Communion may be received on  
the tongue which is the  
universally permitted manner of  
reception in the Catholic Church.  
Where the Bishop permits, as in  
Scotland, the host may,  
alternatively be received on the  
hand

- **The hand.** The host is  
placed on the left hand and  
consumed by lifting the host with  
the fingers of the right hand and  
placing the host reverently in  
one's mouth

- **To be consumed.** In  
whatever manner the host is  
received, it must be consumed  
before leaving the presence of the  
priest or extraordinary minister.  
Try to avoid chewing as this  
detracts from the dignity of the  
sacrament

- **The Blood of Christ.**  
When communicating the  
Precious Blood, we should only  
take a small sip. It should not be  
drunk as if it were a common  
drink. "Taste and see that the Lord  
is good"

- **Kneelers.** To enable  
those who might wish to kneel,  
there will be two kneelers at the  
front. They are of a small size and  
should not obstruct those who  
choose to receive in the hand. Be  
careful at the beginning and we  
will soon get used to things. If  
you observe anyone treating the  
sacrament with disrespect, please  
speak to one of the pass-keepers  
and to myself
