Action of Churches Together in Scotland: Books for Children in South Africa –The United Nations has designated Nelson Mandela's birthday, 18th July, as Nelson Mandela International Day, when people throughout the world are encouraged to give **67 minutes of voluntary service to the community** in whatever way they choose, to help change the world for the better.

ACTSA Scotland (Action for Southern Africa) is asking people to use their 67 minutes to sort out and bring us children's books to be sent to school libraries in Nelson Mandela's home Province of Eastern Cape, with which Scotland has a particular link.

What are needed are children's books of all kinds, in English. This helps to develop fluency in reading English which is vital for all parts of the children's education. (Their mother tongue is mainly Xhosa, but education is mostly in English). Story books or factual books, for all ages from pre-school to teenagers, are welcome – Books that will amuse, absorb, inform and catch their imagination.

They must be in good condition, please – no loose or taped up pages, or badly damaged covers. Factual books should not be too out of date.

Any help with the cost of shipping the books to South Africa would also very welcome – A container holds 1000 boxes, costing £3.50 each to send.

Some facts: The Vigil and Mass take place at the Campus Fidei Guaratiba. [Camp of Faith]

• The terrain of Campus Fidei is 136 million square meters. 4,673 bathrooms will be on hand for pilgrims, of which 270 will be adapted for disabled persons. There will be 615 wash stations, 4,920

drinking fountains, and 2,016 urinals.

• The vigil in Campus Fidei, Guaratiba, will be quite an event in itself. *The Show of Tomorrow*, beginning at 10:30am on Saturday, July 27th, will bring to the stage great Catholic Musicians. Thirteen concerts will happen on Saturday with nearly 50 attractions. The programme will continue until midnight, with an intermission for the Prayer Vigil with Pope Francis. On Sunday two concerts are scheduled before the Mass with the Holy Father and two after. Altogether, there will be nearly 15 hours of presentations and music.
